Post Lawsuit Actions are Critical

WPA's attorneys have acknowledged that the lawsuit is over. Congratulations to all those who contributed to the litigation in any way. They were successful in preventing General Plan 2030 from being implemented. That prevented high density housing from being built off the ends of runways, and prevented runway 8-26 from being closed. The City could have appealed to the State Supreme Court but wisely decided not to.

However, new concerns have emerged. It appears that the City of Watsonville will try to resurrect parts of General Plan 2030. Evidence of this is a memorandum of understanding (MOU) dated June 7, 2010 which referred to General Plan 2030, and remarks by city staff member Keith Boyle. The MOU was a city-county agreement about future land use planning around the airport, prepared by downtown city staff. These references seem strange because the city council on May 11, 2030 rescinded General Plan 2030 and its EIR, complying with the courts decision. Rescind means eliminate or void. The council put GP 2030 is in the garbage can, where it belongs.

To put the post-lawsuit situation in perspective lets quickly review what's transpired:

1996—City rejected a land use plan prepared by the Advisory Committee (WAAC).

2002—City failed to adopt a Compatibility Plan produced by WPA

2003—City declined to accept grants for preparation of an airport land use plan

2005—General Plan 2030 formulated, WPA/ Friends of Buena Vista input ignored.

2005—City Council passed Res. 74-05 eliminating zone 3 in Buena Vista and the density criteria (in the state's planning handbook)

2006—General Plan 2030 final draft with EIR prepared, providing for high density development off the departure end of runway 26. Airport noise problems would be created; and runways 8-26 would have to be closed because of safety and noise.

May 23, 2006--Council approved GP 2030 with a 6-1 vote (Dale Skillicorn voted no)

May 24, 2006—Notification letter to City regarding lawsuit by WPA (et.al.)

March 2007—Superior Court decision: City violated Aeronautics Act and required the City to rescind GP 2030 and its EIR, Res. 74-05 and Statement of Overriding Considerations.

City appealed to 6th Appellate Court in San Jose

March 15, 2010—Appellate Court upheld lower court, plus ruled city "adjusted" factual information.

April 12, 2010—Appeals court changed ruling to "published" making it precedent setting.

May 11, 2010—City Council rescinded GP 2030, its EIR, and Res. 74-05

What transpires post lawsuit is critical and will affect Watsonville Airport long into the future. Both city and county general plans must incorporate land use planning around the airport. How this gets done could be contentious. It seems that whatever the pilot community promotes as a long range solution, the city is opposed to; and whatever the city promotes, the pilot community opposes. Long range, the pilots see the court decision being the best solution because it has more permanence. The appeals court ruling stipulates that the criteria in the Handbook *MUST* be adopted. For local implementation a "General Plan Details" is needed that contains specific and definitive directions for those making planning decisions.
